




How Charities View Gifts of Real Estate

- Actively solicit gifts of real estate in all forms
- Accept them on a case by case basis
- Only accept them as outright gifts
- Do not accept them, period.
- Refer them to a third party
- Discourage donors from considering them

•\$28,000,000,000,000






Additional Motivation

- What is their tolerance for risk?



- Multifaceted Outright Gift






Final Thoughts and Questions
